

No Jindal emails from time in office

Governor's office says the messages are protected or personal

BATON ROUGE — Gov. Bobby Jindal's office has refused to release any of the Republican governor's emails from his two terms, saying the messages are either protected from disclosure under state law or personal in nature.

The Associated Press filed a public records request seeking the documents from the governor, who is

Below-average Atlantic hurricane season anticipated

Forecasters from Colorado State University predicted a "well-belowaverage" Atlantic hurricane season Thursday, anticipating seven tropical storms would form, of which only three would become hurricanes.

A typical year, based on weather records dating to 1950, has 12 tropical storms, of which seven become hurri-

LOCAL FLIER ONCE HEADED

hen the Navy's Blue Angels streak across local skies in early May as headliners at the 2015 Barksdale Air Force Base Defenders of Liberty Open House and Air Show, a bit of Shreveport will be with them — in spirit at least.

Retired Navy Capt. Keith "Casey" Jones, Byrd Class of 1956 and Annapolis Class of 1960, commanded the elite flying team in the mid-1970s, though they flew in A-4 Skyhawks then, not the F-18A Hornets of today.

Jones, still flying at 77, hasn't called Shreveport home since he shook the dust of Byrd off his shoes in 1956, though he has been back for school reunions and funerals. He's attended an air show at Barksdale, but never got to fly with the Blue Angels before a hometown crowd.

'When I commanded the Blue Angels we never did perform there," he said. "Not that I didn't want to, but unfortunately we never got to Barksdale Air Force Base.'

So when he learned the elite team would be at the base this year, following a full five days of the city's first Navy Week, he was pleased.

"I think that's a great idea," he said. "They should bring a ship up the Red River and tie it up alongside the casinos."

That did happen here 150-some years ago when Shreveport was home to a Confederate Navy yard and was the target of a Union cam-
